Microsoft reportedly plans to invest \$10 billion in creator of buzzy A.I. tool ChatGPT






- Microsoft is set to invest \$10 billion in OpenAl as part of a funding round that would value the company at \$29 billion, news site Semafor reported Tuesday.
- Microsoft will reportedly get a 75% share of OpenAl's profits until it makes back the money on its investment, after which the company would assume a 49% stake in OpenAl.
- A bet on ChatGPT could help Microsoft boost its efforts in web search, a market dominated by Google.









DAVOS, Switzerland—<u>Microsoft</u> Corp. <u>MSFT-1.65%</u> ▼ plans to incorporate artificial-intelligence tools like ChatGPT into all of its products and make them available as platforms for other businesses to build on, Chief Executive Satya Nadella said.

Speaking Tuesday at a Wall Street Journal panel at the World Economic Forum's annual event here in the Swiss mountains, Mr. Nadella said that his company will move quickly to commercialize tools from OpenAI, the research lab behind the ChatGPT chatbot as well as image generator Dall-E 2, which <u>turns language prompts into novel images</u>. Microsoft was <u>an early investor</u> in the startup.

ChatGPT: What it is and how it works

ChatGPT is a free chatbot that's available online as a research preview, which OpenAl says will allow the system to learn from real-world use. You can ask ChatGPT straightforward queries like "Show me healthy dinner ideas" or "What's the best way to answer the 'tell me about yourself' question in a job interview?" But ChatGPT can also do things like write poems, songs and essays. You can ask it to compose a holiday greeting card, organize your to-do list and even draft a resignation letter.

The AI is trained on large volumes of data from the internet written by humans, including conversations. But ChatGPT isn't connected to the internet, so it sometimes produces incorrect answers and has limited knowledge.

Here is one definition of ChatGPT

ChatGPT (Generative Pre-trained Transformer)[1] is a chatbot launched by OpenAl in November 2022.

It is built on top of OpenAI's GPT-3 family of large language models, and is fine-tuned (an approach to transfer learning[2]) with both supervised and reinforcement learning techniques.

Transfer learning (TL) is a research problem in machine learning (ML) that focuses on storing knowledge gained while solving one problem and applying it to a different but related problem.[1] For example, knowledge gained while learning to recognize cars could apply when trying to recognize trucks.

Here is another definition

ChatGPT is a large language model (LLM). Large Language Models (LLMs) are trained with massive amounts of data to accurately predict what word comes next in a sentence.

It was discovered that increasing the amount of data increased the ability of the language models to do more.

Some more information

- According to <u>Stanford University</u>:
 - "GPT-3 has 175 billion parameters and was trained on 570 gigabytes of text. For comparison, its predecessor, GPT-2, was over 100 times smaller at 1.5 billion parameters.
- This increase in scale drastically changes the behavior of the model GPT-3 is able to perform tasks it was not explicitly trained on, like translating sentences from English to French, with few to no training examples.



There is also an AI to generate images
