




TripAdvisor




What is STEP?


The Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP) is a free service to allow U.S. citizens and nationals traveling and living abroad to enroll their trip with the nearest U.S. Embassy or Consulate.

Benefits of Enrolling in STEP


- Receive important information from the Embassy about safety conditions in your destination country, helping you make informed decisions about your travel plans.

Online Travel Agencies vs Comparison Sites (Aggregators)

This is without a doubt one of the most commonly asked questions by our users. Let's begin by looking at exactly what each of the options are, and their main advantages and disadvantages.

Let's discuss two terms that are often used interchangeably but are actually quite different

Online Travel Agencies: What you need to know

An online travel agency, or OTA for short, allows for both searching and booking of travel products like hotels and flights. Typically they work directly with airlines and hotels, and then receive a commission for every ticket or room which is booked through them. This is where the basic price difference between OTAs come in, some OTAs, usually bigger, can negotiate a better price with the hotel/airline, or alternatively accept a lower profit margin on each booking. OTAs you've probably heard of include Expedia, Booking.com, Trip.com, Hotels.com and Agoda but there are hundreds out there.

We most commonly hear of OTAs

OTAs are not a new concept

Remember in the old days there were "brick and mortor) travel agencies?

You would go to their office, look through a bunch of brochures

They would suggest hotels and flights for you

You would pick and they would set it all up for you

They got the airline tickets, the hotel reservations, tour info, etc.

And they were paid a commission by all of the above

Today's OTAs do the same thing, just via technology

Aggregators, AKA Meta Search Sites

An aggregator site, also known as a comparison site or a meta-site, allows you to make a single search and compare multiple OTAs in one place. In theory this sounds like the perfect time saver, and it indeed can be, but there are some big caveats. The biggest players in this field include Skyscanner, Kayak, Trivago and HotelsCombined.

Most aggregators will redirect you to the OTAs individual site to book, so in the end you're actually booking in the same place. In the last few years, some have added the ability to make direct bookings through their own individual platforms.

And then there are the Aggregators

Booking Holdings Inc. is an American travel technology company organized in Delaware and based in Norwalk, Connecticut, that owns and operates several travel fare aggregators and travel fare metasearch engines including namesake and flagship Booking.com, Priceline.com, Agoda.com, Kayak.com, Cheapflights, Rentalcars.com, Momondo, and OpenTable. It operates websites in about 40 languages and 200 countries.

In 2017, 89% of its gross profit was made outside the United States– most of which used Booking.com.^{[5][6]}

In 2019, consumers booked 845 million room nights of accommodation, 77 million rental car days, and 7 million airplane tickets using websites owned by Booking Holdings.^[5]

In 2017, 93.4% of revenues were derived from commissions and 6.6% of revenues were derived from advertising.^[5]

With all these choices of travel sites/apps, what are the differences?

Which should I use?

There are several advantages of using an OTA

One stop shopping

You may get good pricing on "packages" (airfare, hotel, excursions)

You can search a huge variety of choices

You can find "out of the way" or unique small hotels

But there are disadvantages

One of the main disadvantages of online travel agencies is that all changes and cancellations need to be made directly through the OTA.

So, this means that if a guest is checking into a hotel and has an issue with the reservation, the guest will need to contact the travel agency in which they booked through.

In many cases, the hotel will not be able to make changes and cancellations without confirmation from the online travel site

Be aware of airline aspects

The same is true for airline companies as well.

When a guest books an airline ticket through Expedia, they will need to make cancellations and changes directly through Expedia instead of the airline itself.

This may become a bit confusing, especially if the guest books their ticket far in advance.

And more

If the guest is in a rush to get to the airport and then finds out that there is a problem with the airline booking, they will have to contact Expedia or whichever site they booked through to fix the issue, which can take extra time especially during a high-volume call period.






