The Daily - 20 min a day, 5x week, - biggest news stories of the day told by the reporter.

Crime Junkie - true crime genre - for those who like fun facts about notorious crimes.

Fresh Air - hosted by Terry Gross - out of Phila. - WHYY, and an award winner. Weekday magazine of contemporary arts & issues. Released in 1975.

<u>This American Life</u> - Hosted by Ira Glass - 2.2 million listeners & has been around 20 years. Award winner (Peabody). Short stories and essays on so many topics

<u>Stuff You should Know</u> -20-60 minutes, around since 2008, interesting facts about all kinds of things from champagne to satanism, LSD and chaos theory.

<u>The Bill Simmons Podcast</u> - the most downloaded sports podcast of all time - rotating crew of quests.

<u>Smartless</u> - Comedy genre with Jason Bateman, Sean Hayes and Will Arnett - connects & unites people from all walks of life to learn about shared experiences through thoughtful dialogue.

My Favorite Murder - guess the genre -another true crime podcast started in 2016.

<u>Radio Lab</u> - long form journalism - asks deep questions & uses investigative journalism to get answers. Started in 2002, e.g., animal minds - can whales be gracious or a leopard seal fall in love with its photographer.

<u>Planet Money</u> – give the hosts a topic & they can link it to the economy. 15-30 minutes, started in 2008. E.g., The economic lessons in children's books. Visit to an elementary school to teach 3rd graders economics using some beloved children's books.

<u>Freakonmics</u> - tells you things you thought you knew - topics have included minimum wage, rent control, talks with Nobel Lauerates & many others. Concept is to help people make better decisions when they have facts and sometimes incentives.
