Ken Raske, Director, Education, solicits instructors and classes for the GCC. He provides the web-based registration information and conducts registration processes.

Joe Scanlon, Immediate Past President, provides support to the current president and plans the Volunteer Dinner in the spring.

Other non-elected volunteers:

Edward Jones has replaced Al Borkin as Purchasing Coordinator. The Purchasing Coordinator makes the purchases required for the GCC and takes care of all printing requests.

Bob Crawford, Webmaster, maintains the GCC website and was instrumental in writing the web-based registration, monitor sign-in, membership records, and class information sections on the website.

We now have two **Assistant Tech Directors: Jim Geffre and Al Borkin**, who assist Don Noteboom and help out at Tech Talk..

Fran Morris, Historian, keeps the pictorial history of the GCC and maintains pictorial albums.

We have started the New Year in a big way. We have completely changed our software systems for all of our normal operations.

We have new databases that are web-based for monitoring, membership tracking, classes, instructors, and enrollment. Our winter enrollment went very well using our newly implemented web-based enrollment system. We had a grand total of 311 members signed up in January, 2007 for our classes. A big THANK YOU to all those who helped in the Winter 2007 class registrations during our first on-line signup process, including all helpers, cashiers, Instructors, officers, and all others who helped. Bob Crawford did an awesome job in software development for our class enrollment.

I thought it would be timely to mention some of our accomplishments during 2006. We have upgraded our open use room with new computers, added new Macs and new Mac classes, formed a New Technologies SIG, and implemented a web-based enrollment system and membership system. We have also begun a monthly e-mail newsletter to our membership, improved our website, and implemented a new Mac website.

We have obtained an OK from CAM to begin a web-based payment system for classes. If all goes well, members will be able to enroll over the web in March with the ability to pay for classes using a credit card.
