

New Grand Computer Club Officers for 2009

The Grand Computer Club welcomes Loren Lundquist, Vice President, Diana Lundquist, Treasurer, and Jeff Taylor, Technical Director, to the Board of Directors of the 2009 Grand Computer Club. We feature Loren and Diane this month and will feature Jeff in February.



Diana Lundquist was raised in Kansas City, Kansas. She grew up in a railroad family; her father worked for the Atchison, Topeka, and the Santa Fe RR; and many of her male ancestors were railroad men. After high school in Kansas City, she did her undergraduate work at

Emporia State Teacher's College (now Emporia State University) and then taught junior high school mathematics in Kansas City for 7 years. During summers of her teaching years, Diana earned a Master of Science in Mathematics from Ohio State University.



Loren Lundquist was born in Louisiana to parents from Minnesota, 3 weeks before his father, an Army Air Corps pilot, flew to Egypt for WWII. Loren and his mother lived in Minnesota until his father returned from overseas. His father stayed in the Army and then the Air Force after WWII and

the family moved around quite a bit, so Loren considers himself a citizen at large without a specific hometown. Living in Berlin, Germany, for 3 years, Loren was the first person to become an Eagle Scout behind the Iron Curtain. After high school near Dayton, Ohio, Loren received a Bachelor of Science in Physics from Ohio State University and was commissioned in the Army. His specialties were Field Artillery and Atomic Energy. Loren commanded 2 field artillery batteries in the central highlands of Vietnam, earning 2 Bronze Stars

and a Purple Heart. He earned a Master of Science in Physics from Ohio State University and a Master of Military Arts and Sciences in Nuclear Strategy from the Army Command and General Staff College, Ft. Leavenworth, KS.

Loren and Diana met in 1974 while he was serving at Ft. Leavenworth. They were married in 1975. They have 2 children. Their daughter Loraine was born in Albuquerque, NM, in mid 1977 (she is now a professor of physics and astronomy at a college in southern Illinois and she and her husband presented Diana and Loren with a grandson in July, 2008). Their son Gilmore was born 18 months later in Alexandria, VA, at the end of 1978. (He is a software engineer and lives with his wife in the Dallas suburb of Sachse.)

In 1979-80 Loren deployed to Korea where he commanded a field artillery battalion north of Seoul near the Demilitarized Zone. On his return, the family moved to Los Alamos, NM, where Loren designed the primary (atomic bomb portion) of the warhead that flies on the Navy's Trident II Submarine Launched Ballistic Missile. Three years later, the family moved to Germantown, MD, where Loren was assigned to the nuclear weapons safety desk at Department of Energy headquarters. At the end of 1984 Loren retired with 20½ years of service.

The family moved back to Los Alamos, NM, where Loren hired on as a nuclear explosive design physicist in the Primary Design Group of the Los Alamos National Laboratory. He served as a design physicist, as a team leader and finally as a deputy group leader. He received two of the Laboratory's Distinguished Performance Awards and five of the Department of Energy's "Award of Excellence for Significant Contribution to the Nuclear Weapons Program". As the children grew, Diana volunteered in the schools and then moved to working with the county senior programs. She finished as the county senior program's business manager.

Loren and Diana closed on a house in Sun City Grand in September, 2003, and moved here permanently in April 2004. In addition to being active and an instructor in the computer club, Diana is in the photography club, the 150 golf club, Lady Putters, the Pickleball Club, and the Grand Singers. She is a past treasurer of the 150 golf club and currently keeps the handicaps for the 150 Golf Club and for Lady Putters.

Loren is also a computer club instructor and a member of the photography club and Grand woodcrafters. Both Loren and Diana enjoy travel.

CLASS REGISTRATION OPENS 9:00 AM January 17, 2009

Members register for classes in one of four ways:

1. Off-site, members may register on line by following the instructions on page 6 of this newsletter or on our website. This may be done ANY TIME after 9:00 AM on Saturday, January 17.
2. On-site, members may register at the Club between 9:00 AM and 11:30 AM on Saturday, January 17.
 - a. A schedule of classes is available online or at the Club.
 - b. Make your selections using the form online or at the Club.
 - c. Bring the registration form to the Club on Saturday morning, January 17.
 - d. Six-to-nine registrars will be available to help you register at the club. You may pay by PayPal, check or cash.
3. From Monday, January 19, to Friday, January 23, a SINGLE registrar will be available every afternoon to help members register for classes.
4. Throughout the rest of the class term, members may get personal help with registration on Tuesday afternoons from 2:00 to 3:30.

Registration in class is FINAL. NO REFUNDS except when changes are necessary due to Bereavement, Serious Illness, and Jury Duty. Transfers are encouraged.

Club may reschedule classes as necessary to keep adequate class size.

Instructions for On-line Registration

You may register for classes using any computer with Internet access.

1. Click the [Member Login](#) button on the Home page.
2. Enter your user ID and password. Your user ID is your 7-digit CAM number. Your password is your first name, with the first letter capitalized, followed by the first four digits of your CAM number, no space, e.g. Mark2580
3. Click on the "Register for classes" link.
4. Select the course you want to take from the list at the lower left. You may need to scroll down to find the course.
5. Read the list of prerequisite skills necessary for the class.
6. Select the class by date and time from the list of available classes. Only classes with open seats are listed.
7. Click the Regular or Laptop box (showing available seats, "0" means none available) to register for the class.
8. For additional courses, continue to scroll and click on those you want. The maximum you may register in is 5.
9. The list at the top of the page shows the classes you are enrolled in. You may need to scroll up to view the list.
10. If you want to change or cancel a class, simply click on the class you are enrolled in to automatically withdraw from it.
11. When you have registered for all classes you want, click the "View Invoice" button.
12. Verify the classes are correct print your invoice.
13. You may pay with PayPal (you do have to belong) or by check or cash at the club room. By PayPal, click the "Pay using PayPal" button and follow the PayPal instructions. Print or save a copy of your PayPal invoice and click the "Return to Merchant".
14. To pay for your classes at the club room click "Done" and do that.

Your seat in the class will not be guaranteed until you pay for it. PayPal lets you pay immediately which will guarantee your seat. If you choose not to pay using PayPal, come to the club room as soon as possible and make your payment to the monitor (bring your invoice number or a copy of the invoice).

*** You can register for a laptop seat if you have a laptop and are willing to bring it to the class. Your laptop must have all necessary software installed on it.**
