## A Message from President Ray Hockstad

We are off to a good start this New Year with a very successful new registration for the extensive classes we offer to our members. Our Education Department under the guidance of Ken Raske and all our volunteer instructors offered a total of 37 different PC courses and 34 different Mac courses. Most of the courses had multiple sessions for a total of 71 separate PC classes and 41 separate Mac classes, a grand total of 112 classes.

Registration for all these classes, under the direction of Loren Lundquist and all his volunteers, was very smooth and successful. On Friday and Saturday, they registered 166 people for a total of about 430 classes. Since the regular registration, 46 more members registered on line for 82 classes. So there are now 212 of our members registered in 512 classes. WOW!!!

I urge you to retain the default, which is: Member ID = 7-digit CAM number (i.e. 1234-000)  
Password = First name followed by first 4 digits of CAM number (i.e. Jane1234). If you would like to set up a free e-mail address, I'll be happy to help you with that. - Gretel.

them. Remember Your Member ID is your CAM number with the zeros, and your password, unless you have changed it, is your first name as you are registered with the club, capitalizing the first letter only, followed with no space and the first 4 numbers of your CAM number.


Our monitors are what keeps our computer open space room going! They are dependable and put in many hours each month. Below are some of our loyal and dependable monitors.





## A Message from Don Exner, Monitor Director

I know you all have met the clubroom monitors. These are the people that sit at the front desk and log you in by swiping your CAM card through the card reader. But they also do other things, such as answer questions about the club when a non-member expresses interest, assist people with membership sign-up or renewal, and assist with class registration. Many of the monitors serve once a month or more, but many also serve only once or twice a year.

When you talk to the monitors you find that there are varied reasons for them volunteering. Most say they enjoy meeting people, and many also add that they feel they should contribute something in return for the excellent facilities that the club provides. Of course there is also the "pot-sweetener" of the annual Volunteer Dinner.

Monitors who volunteer five or more times in a calendar year are invited to the volunteer dinner hosted by the club. Thirty-six members met that criterion last year and will be attending the dinner in March, along with others who volunteer for in other ways. The dinner is always fun, with dinner, entertainment and good company.

We encourage you to become a monitor. The duties are simple, and you are not required (or expected) to be a computer expert.

## CLEANING CREW

In the past we have had a volunteer cleaning crew who came in for an hour or so once a month and cleaned the open-use room and the classroom. The CAM cleaning force will sweep the carpet and empty the trash baskets, but they will not clean the tables, screens, keyboards or mice. The cleaning crew was discontinued in favor of a single individual doing it, but the consensus is that previous system worked better.

Three people can do the job in about an hour. It needs to be done every 3-4 weeks during the peak-use season (January through March), less often at other times. ## Security Cameras

As we all know we can hardly step out in public anymore without being recorded by a security camera. Almost every place of business has them, and they are even spreading to the outdoors in heavily trafficked areas. Well, now security cameras have come to Grand Computers. Due to two recent overnight thefts of equipment from the club room the Board of Directors voted to install security cameras in each of the three rooms of the club, including the back room not normally open to everyone.

This was approved by the members at the December General Membership Meeting. By the time you read this they will be up and running. In each case the cameras will be located at the front of the room, so there can be no possibility of anything on the computer screens being seen by them. All three cameras will be continuously recorded, with the information retained for approximately a month.
