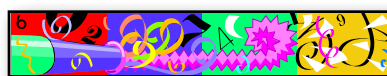
Same Face in a New Place

By Department of Education*

Winter/Spring 2010 classes at the Grand Computers Club are now available for viewing online.

Registration both online or at the Chaparral Center, will begin at 9:00 A.M. on Saturday, January 9.

Recently added NEW courses include several regarding Adobe 7.0 (photo organizing, editing, and project creating), a generic email management course, Facebook, Seminar on the differences between XP, Vista and Windows 7, Skype, Website development, iCal for Macs, iPhone for the Mac or PC, and e-Bay. In total, over 50 separate courses are offered for PCs and over 40 for Macs.

Residents can see descriptions for all courses offered by Grand Computers by logging onto the website [www.grandcomputers.org](http://www.grandcomputers.org) and selecting **Education**, followed by **Course Listing**.

Membership must be up-to-date for those registering for classes. *To become a member* of Grand Computers, on the above website, select **Member Application** and follow the directions from there. *Members renewing* their membership should click the Member Login button and log in, you will see a link that says, "Click here to renew using Pay Pal". Or you may renew at the Computer Room. The cost of a Membership is \$20, and memberships are effective through December 31, 2010.

Directions on how to register online for Winter/Spring classes are available on the website, by selecting **Education** and then **Register Online**. To register in person, check in at the Chaparral Center, Apache Room, at 9 a.m. Saturday, January 9. We will also hold free 1/2 hour seminars every half hour from 9 to 11 a.m on Thursday, January 7, and Friday, January 8. Just drop in and learn how to 1.) renew your club membership; 2.) how to register for a class(es); and 3.) how to pay for anything through PayPal, the secure method of paying for products and services purchased online.



*A Tip from the Webmaster:*

Both PC and Mac classes will meet in the classroom beginning with the Winter term. The class calendars have been changed to distinguish PC classes from Mac classes. PC classes are shown in a blue, normal font. Mac classes are shown in a red, italic font. Hover the mouse over or click on a class for more information about that class.

**Microsoft Office 2010 Beta**

Microsoft released the Beta or final test version of its new office suite for public download ([www.microsoft.com/office/2010](http://www.microsoft.com/office/2010)) and trial just before Christmas. Anyone can download a fully functional five program office suite (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Outlook, and OneNote) to your computer for free. Office 2010 is scheduled to go on sale in April, 2010. The Beta download will continue to work until October 31, 2010 at which point it will stop working and will have to be replaced by a purchased version of Office 2010, (or you could revert to whatever edition you currently own). Office 2007 was a major change from Office 2003 and previous versions, changing from drop-down menus to ribbons. Office 2010 maintains the look and feel of the 2007 version and mainly adds capability. Thus, if you look at a ribbon from say Excel 2007 and compare it to the corresponding ribbon in Excel 2010 they are going to look the same except that the Excel 2010 ribbon might have an extra button or two. For example, there is a button to imbed a screen print in your spreadsheet.

I believe that you can draw two conclusions from this. First, if you were considering upgrading to Office 2007, I would recommend NOT buying 2007, but, rather, going directly to 2010. Download 2010 Beta and use it until next summer. Then decide whether to buy 2010 or to go back to whatever you have been using. Second, Grand Computers will be teaching classes this term for Word 2007, Excel 2007, and PowerPoint 2007. Those classes will be directly applicable to Word 2010, Excel 2010 and PowerPoint 2010. Learning how to do some basic task in say, Excel 2007 should be almost identical to doing that task in Excel 2010.

### *Microsoft Office 2010 (con't)*

I said *almost* identical. What are some of the differences between 2007 and 2010? I mentioned that more capability has been added. Most of it is directed at large groups working concurrently on a single document—a situation not really applicable to most members of Grand Computers. Two things will be of interest. First, 2007 accesses file functions (such as save, save as, print) with the “office button” in the upper left corner, above the row of tabs that control the ribbons. In 2010 there is no “office button”, those functions are accessed by a new tab labeled FILE. It is located on the far left of the row of ribbon control tabs and is a different color from them. The other change in 2010 is the ability in any of the office programs to add a new blank ribbon, name it, and then add any commands that you want to it. Microsoft thinks that most people will want to add the commands that they use all the time so that they can operate most of the time from their customized ribbon without having to switch back and forth between ribbons. The commands will still be in their normal place on the other ribbons but will be duplicated on the custom ribbon.

Let's end with a couple of procedural notes. When you download Office 2010 Beta, one of the early screens will have a long serial number. Print or copy it as you will need it after the install. As you finish the download and begin the install, you will be asked if you want to upgrade or add Beta to your computer. Upgrade means that you want the installer to remove all previous versions of Office and leave you with just Office 2010. Add means that the installer will leave older versions of Office as they are and add Office 2010. There is no problem with running multiple versions of Word, Excel, and PowerPoint. Outlook and OneNote however cannot co-exist with another version. If your computer has an earlier version of Outlook and you open Outlook 2010, Outlook 2010 will replace the earlier version. If you never open Outlook 2010, your earlier version will work fine. The same is true with OneNote.

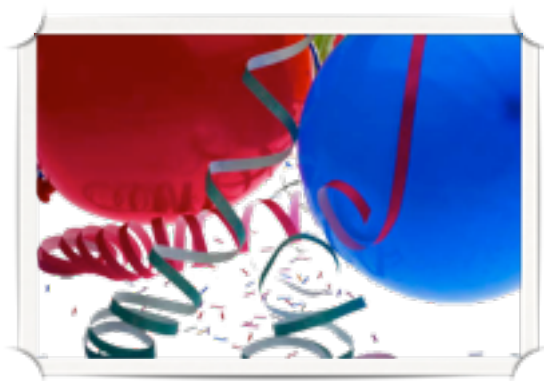
