
and hope you feel the same!

Email is not secure!

It's almost tax season again and time for my annual warning about email.

"Email is not secure!"

On tech help Tuesday, a member came in and asked for help emailing documents to his new financial advisor. The documents included his W2 statements, tax returns and his driver's license.

I told him "NO" I would not help him and then explained that the only way to send sensitive documents (documents containing Social Security numbers, account numbers, driver's license numbers etc.) is for his financial adviser to send him a link to a secured server so that data can be transferred safely using encryption.

After explaining the reasons why not to send sensitive documents over email the member asked me "what if my financial adviser doesn't know how to send me a link to a secured server?" "FIRE HIM!" Because he doesn't get it.

When I needed a loaner car from my car dealer, the dealer asked me to email them a scan of my license and credit card. "Are you crazy?" I said, "I might as well post the scans on Facebook for everyone to see. I refused to send the scans via email and of course didn't get the loaner. I complained to the service manager, but he didn't get it, so I FIRED HIM and switched dealers.

It is the policy of Tech Help not to send sensitive data using email.

Okay Dan, what am I supposed to do? I have to get account information to my tax guy and he doesn't know how to set up an encrypted server.

You must go "old school". Get an envelope and put some stamps on it because even in 2022 there is still only one way to send a document securely that is protected by law and backed up by an arm of the federal government with badges and guns (shameless plug ahead) and that of course that is the United States Postal Service.
