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President's Column: Calling All Candidates for 2024 - We need you!

The executive board of our Club has been working on succession planning - considering the future plans of current board members and considering the vast talent pool of our current membership.

Our term for board members is currently one year. Most of our members serve two or more years and some are dedicated well beyond two years and continue serving indefinitely in their positions. We are blessed to benefit from their commitment to our club with their specialized skills and knowledge.

Recently, the Grand Board of Directors voted to limit terms for chartered club board members to 4 consecutive years. If a club wishes to extend the terms beyond this limit, they must receive a vote of $\frac{2}{3}$ of voting members to do so. We are in this position for our 2024 board. We have three board positions with incumbents exceeding the 4 consecutive year limit who wish to continue: Treasurer (Debbie Meyer), Education Director (Marie Frasca) and Technical Director (Ted Gray).

We have three board members who are within the 4 year limit: Membership (Kathy Cracraft), Tech Help (Clay Stephens), Secretary (Gaile Brinkman). They have indicated their intention to continue in these positions for 2024.

Remaining board positions will be open without incumbents: President, Vice President, and Monitor Director.

We will hold elections at our December General Meeting and present a slate of candidates at that time. This slate will include our incumbents noted above and additional candidates wishing to serve on the 2024 Board.

If you are interested in discussing ANY of these positions - whether there are incumbents or not - please talk to any board member. We will be creating a Nominating Committee in the near future and this group will work with those interested in pursuing a position on the board and soliciting members they feel have the potential to serve on the board.

We hope you will consider becoming more active in any of our club volunteer activities - there are many to consider.

Tech Help: Computer Support and You!

If you search on "What percent of seniors own computers", you will find that

approximately 30 percent of computer owners are older than 55 with 23 percent of owners at 75 or older! It is also understood that seniors have a lower adoption of technology than the general public, however, the gap in technology use between seniors and the general public has grown much smaller over the last decade!

As an exercise in guestimation: If you take the above 30 percent and apply it to the Grand Community population of approximately 17,000 people, you get a general number of around 5000 computers in our community (NOT including smart phones which are basically handheld computers). If each of these computer owners needed

support 2 times a year (not uncommon) then you would have over 10,000 support opportunities! That is a big support demand!

The Grand residents who are members of the Computer Club are fortunate to have Tech Help on Tuesdays to get the support they need for their computers and cell phones. Now if you don't want to join the Computer Club but still need support, there are several individuals who have small businesses (called In-Home Technical Services) who can supply computer support to our fellow grand community residents in their home. You would need to use the business card and contact the business to inquire about costs and availability. 




